# TARIFF FORMAT

- A. Sheet Numbering: Sheet numbers appear in the upper right corner of the page. Sheets are numbered sequentially. However, new sheets are occasionally added to the tariff. When a new sheet is added between sheets already in effect, a decimal is added. For example, a new sheet added between pages 11 and 12 would be page 11.1.
- B. Sheet Revision Numbers: Revision numbers also appear in the upper right corner of each sheet where applicable. These numbers are used to indicate the most current page version on file with the PPUC. For example, 4th Revised Sheet 13 cancels 3rd Revised Sheet 13. Because of the various suspension periods, deferrals, etc. the PPUC follows in their tariff approval process, the most current sheet number on file with the Commission is not always the tariff page in effect. Consult the Check Sheet for the sheets currently in effect.
- C. Paragraph Numbering Sequence: There are nine levels of paragraph coding. Each level of coding is subservient to its next higher level:

# SECTION 2 - RULES AND REGULATIONS

# 2.1 <u>Undertaking of IDT America</u>

This tariff contains the regulations and rates applicable to intrastate resale and alternate operator telecommunications services provided by IDT America for telecommunications between points within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Resale and alternate operator services are furnished subject to the availability of facilities and subject to the terms and conditions of this tariff. The Company offers service to all those who desire to purchase service from the Company consistent with all of the provisions of this tariff. Customers or subscribers interested in the Company's services shall file a service application with the Company which fully identifies the customer, the services requested and other information requested by the Company

- 2.1.1 IDT America may, from time to time, offer various enhanced services and information services within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Such services will be provided pursuant to contract and will not be governed by this tariff. IDT America will furnish the Commission with a copy of any such offering at least thirty (30) days prior to such implementation.
- 2.1.2 IDT America may also, from time to time, offer switching, transmission, and/or operated assisted services to other telecommunications providers for resale to such companies' customers. The rates for any such services will be determined pursuant to contract, to the extent authorized by the PPUC, and rates and sections of this tariff will not apply thereto.
- 2.1.3 The resale and alternate operator services of IDT America are not part of a joint undertaking with any other entity providing telecommunications channels, facilities, or services, but do involve the resale of the Message Toll Services (MTS) and Wide Area Telecommunications Services (WATS) of underlying common carriers subject to the jurisdiction of this Commission.

# 2.1 Undertaking of IDT America (cont'd)

- 2.1.4 The rates and regulations contained in this tariff apply only to the resale and operator assisted services furnished by IDT America and do not apply, unless otherwise specified, to the lines, facilities, or services provided by a local exchange telephone company or other common carrier for use in accessing the services of IDT America.
- 2.1.5 The services of IDT America shall be furnished to customers who are patrons, patients, students, and other authorized users of the terminal telephone or other facilities of privately or publicly owned coin and coinless operated telephone station providers, hotels/motels, hospitals, airports, colleges, universities, and other subscribers. IDT America enters into arrangements with such subscribers providing for the availability of IDT America's nationwide services, including the intrastate services offered under the terms and conditions of this tariff.

#### 2.2 Use of Services

- 2.2.1 IDT America's services may be used for any lawful purpose consistent with the transmission and switching parameters of the telecommunications facilities utilized in the provision of services.
- 2.2.2 The use of IDT America's services to make calls which might reasonably be expected to frighten, abuse, torment, or harass another or in such a way as to unreasonably interfere with use by others is prohibited.

# 2.2 <u>Use of Services</u> (cont'd)

- 2.2.3 The use of IDT America's services without payment for services or attempting to avoid payment for service by fraudulent means or devices, schemes, false or invalid numbers, or false calling or credit cards is prohibited.
- 2.2.4 IDT America's services are available for use twenty-four hours per day, seven days per week.
- 2.2.5 IDT America does not transmit messages, but the services may be used for that purpose.
- 2.2.6 IDT America's services may be denied for nonpayment of charges or for other violations of this tariff.

# 2.3 Liability of IDT America

- 2.3.1 IDT America shall not be liable for loss or damage sustained by reason of any failure in or breakdown of facilities associated with IDT America's resale or operator assisted service or for any interruption or delay of services, whatever shall be the cause of such failure, breakdown or interruption and whether negligent or otherwise and however long it shall last. In no event shall IDT America's liability for any services exceed the charges applicable under this tariff for such service.
- 2.3.2 IDT America shall be indemnified and saved harmless by any subscriber, customer or by any other entity against claims for libel, slander or the infringement of copyright arising from the material transmitted over its resale or operator assisted services; and against all other claims arising out of any act or omission of a subscriber or of any other entity in connection with the resale or operator assisted services provided by IDT America.

- 2.3.3 IDT America shall not be liable for any act or omission of any entity furnishing facilities or services connected with or provided in conjunction with the resale or operator assisted services provided by IDT America.
- 2.3.4 IDT America shall not be liable for any personal injury or death of any person or persons, or for any loss or damage sustained by reason of acts, mistakes, omissions, errors or defects in providing its resale or operator assisted services, whatever shall be the cause and whether negligent or otherwise.
- 2.3.5 IDT America shall not be liable for and shall be indemnified and saved harmless by any subscriber, customer or by any other entity from any and all loss, claims, demands, suits, or other action or any liability whatsoever, whether suffered, made, instituted, or asserted by any subscriber, customer or any other entity for any personal injury to, or death of, any person or persons, and for any loss, damage, defacement or destruction of the premises of any subscriber, customer or any other entity or any other property whether owned or controlled by the subscriber, customer or others, caused or claimed to have been caused, directly or indirectly, by any act or omission of the subscriber, customer, or others or by any installation, operation, failure to operate, maintenance, removal, presence, condition, location or use of facilities or equipment provided by IDT America which is not the direct result of IDT America's gross negligence. No agents or employees of any other entity shall be deemed to be the agents or employees of IDT America.

# 2.3 Liability of IDT America (cont'd)

2.3.6 IDT America shall not be liable for any failure of performance due to causes beyond its control, including, without limitation, acts of God, fires, floods or other catastrophes, national emergencies, insurrections, riots or wars, strikes, lockouts, work stoppages or other labor difficulties, and any law, order regulation or other action of any governing authority or agency thereof.

# 2.4 Responsibilities of the Subscriber

- 2.4.1 The subscriber is responsible for placing any necessary orders and complying with tariff regulations and for assuring that customers comply with tariff regulations. The subscriber is also responsible for the payment of charges for calls originated at the subscriber's number which are not collect, third party, calling card, or credit card calls.
- 2.4.2 The subscriber is responsible for charges incurred for special construction and/or special facilities which the subscriber requests and which are ordered by IDT America on the subscriber's behalf.
- 2.4.3 If required for the provision of IDT America's services, the subscriber must provide any equipment space, supporting structure, conduit and electrical power without charge to IDT America.
- 2.4.4 The subscriber is responsible for arranging access to its premises at times mutually agreeable to IDT America and the subscriber when required for IDT America personnel to install, repair, maintain, program, inspect or remove equipment associated with the provision of IDT America's services.

#### Responsibilities of the Subscriber (cont'd) 2.4

- 2.4.5 The subscriber shall cause the temperature and relative humidity in the equipment space provided by subscriber for the installation of IDT America's equipment to be maintained within the range normally provided for the operation of microcomputers.
- 2.4.6 The subscriber shall ensure that the equipment and/or system is properly interfaced with IDT America's facilities or services, that the signals emitted into IDT America's network are of the proper mode, bandwidth, power and signal level for the intended use of the subscriber and in compliance with criteria set forth in this tariff, and that the signals do not damage equipment, injure personnel, or degrade service to other subscribers. If the Federal Communications Commission or some other appropriate certifying body certifies terminal equipment as being technically acceptable for direct electrical connection with interstate communications service, IDT America will permit such equipment to be connected with its channels without the use of protective interface device.

If the subscriber fails to maintain the equipment and/or the system properly, with resulting imminent harm to IDT America equipment, personnel or the quality of service to other subscribers, IDT America may, upon written notice, require the use of protective equipment at the subscriber's expense. If this fails to produce satisfactory quality and safety, IDT America may, upon written notice, terminate the subscriber's service.

The subscriber must pay IDT America for replacement or repair of damage to the equipment or facilities of IDT America caused by negligence or willful act of the subscriber, customers or others by improper use of the services, or by use of equipment provided by subscriber, customer or others.

# 2.4 Responsibilities of the Subscriber (cont'd)

- 2.4.8 The subscriber must pay for the loss through theft of any IDT America equipment installed at subscriber's premises.
- 2.4.9 The subscriber shall place tent cards, telephone stickers or other printed documentation furnished by or with the approval of IDT America on or in close proximity to all telephones capable of accessing IDT America's services and shall take reasonable actions to replace any documentation which may be removed, defaced or otherwise rendered unavailable.
- 2.4.10 If IDT America installs equipment at subscriber's premises, the subscriber shall be responsible for payment of an installation charge.

# 2.5 Responsibilities of the Customer

- 2.5.1 The customer is responsible for payment of the charges set forth in this tariff unless the responsibility for such payment has been accepted by the called party, a third party, or a subscriber.
- 2.5.2 The customer is responsible for compliance with the applicable regulations set forth in this tariff.
- 2.5.3 The customer is responsible for establishing its identity as often as necessary during the course of a call.
- 2.5.4 The customer is responsible for identifying the station, party, or person with whom communication is desired and/or made at the called number.

# 2.6 Cancellation or Interruption of Services

- 2.6.1 Without incurring liability, upon ten (10) working days' (defined as any day on which the company's business office is open and the U.S. Mail is delivered) written notice to the subscriber, IDT America may immediately discontinue services to a subscriber or may withhold the provisions of ordered or contracted services:
  - 2.6.1.A For nonpayment of any sum due IDT America for more than thirty (30) days after issuance of the bill for the amount due,
  - 2.6.1.B For violation of any of the provisions of this tariff,
  - 2.6.1.C For violation of any law, rule, regulation, policy of any governing authority having jurisdiction over IDT America's services, or
  - 2.6.1.D By reason of any order or decision of a court, public service commission or federal regulatory body or other governing authority prohibiting IDT America from furnishing its services.
- 2.6.2 Without incurring liability, IDT America may interrupt the provision of services at any time in order to perform tests and inspections to assure compliance with tariff regulations and the proper installation and operations of subscriber and IDT America's equipment and facilities and may continue such interruption until any items of noncompliance or improper equipment operation so identified are rectified.

# 2.6 Cancellation or Interruption of Services (cont'd)

2.6.3 Service may be discontinued by IDT America without notice to the subscriber, by blocking traffic to certain countries, cities or NXX exchanges, or by blocking calls using certain customer authorization codes, when IDT America deems it necessary to take such action to prevent unlawful use of its service. IDT America will restore service as soon as it can be provided without undue risk, and will, upon request by the customer affected, assign a new authorization code to replace the one that has been deactivated.

# 2.7 Credit Allowance

- 2.7.1 Credit allowance for the interruption of service which is not due to the Company's testing or adjusting, negligence of the customer, or to the failure of channels or equipment provided by the customer, are subject to the general liability provisions set forth in 2.3 herein. It shall be the obligation of the customer to notify the Company immediately of any interruption in service for which a credit allowance is desired. Before giving such notice, the customer shall ascertain that the trouble is not being caused by any action or omission by the customer within his control, or is not in wiring or equipment, if any, furnished by the customer and connected to the Company's facilities.
- 2.7.2 For purposes of credit computation, every month shall be considered to have 720 hours.
- 2.7.3 No credit shall be allowed for an interruption of a continuous duration of less than two hours.

## 2.7 Credit Allowance (cont'd)

2.7.4 The Customer shall be credited for an interruption of two hours or more at the rate of 1/720th of the monthly charge for the facilities affected for each hour or major fraction thereof that the interruption continues.

Credit formula: Credit =  $\frac{A}{720}$  x B

"A" - outage time in hours

"B" - monthly charge for affected activity

#### 2.8 Restoration of Service

The use and restoration of service shall be in accordance with the priority system specified in part 64, Subpart D of the Rules and Regulations of the Federal Communications.

## 2.9 Deposit

The Company reserves the right to examine the credit record of all service applicants and may require a deposit when determined to be necessary to assure future payment. Security deposits required will be equal to not more than two (2) months' estimated usage as computed by the Company and will in all respects be consistent with Commission regulations at 2 Pa. Code Sections 64.31-64.41.

#### 2.10 Collection Costs

The customers shall be liable to the Company for all costs of collection.

## 2.11 Taxes

All federal, state and local taxes, assessments, surcharges, or fees, including sales taxes, use taxes, gross receipts taxes, and municipal utilities taxes, are billed as separate line items and are not included in the rates quoted herein, except as described for Prepaid Calling Cards, Rechargeable Calling Cards and the DSA Telecom Calling Card. A flat tax rate of 20% will be applied to all charges associated with the DSA Telecom Calling Card. # 3.4 Contested Charges

Billing disputes shall be processed by the Company consistent with Commission regulations at 52. Pa. Code Chapter 64. Any objection to billed charges should be reported promptly to IDT America. Adjustments to customers' bills shall be made to the extent that records are available and/or circumstances exist which reasonably indicate that such charges are not in accordance with approved rates or that an adjustment may otherwise be appropriate.
